Morley Senior High School provides a comprehensive curriculum that caters for the academic, vocational and developmental needs of all students from years 8 to 12. Very experienced and dedicated staff members guide our students' to reach their potential in a caring and nurturing environment. Your child can participate in a range of specialised and challenging courses and extra-curricula activities that expand their learning and creative opportunities.

The variety of challenging academic and vocational subjects and courses available, ultimately leads Morley students to university entrance, further training or their chosen career. Our students are challenged to be critical thinkers and problem solvers and benefit from the latest technology, including a one to one laptop program that allows each student access to a personal laptop.



Specialist programmes in Aviation, Multimedia and Broadcasting, and Soccer are available for students with a passion in these fields. Numerous students have graduated from these programmes and moved into successful careers in their specialised areas.

Morley Senior High School has a successful Vocational Education and Training program. Our students complete nationally recognised certificate courses with specialised training and workplace learning opportunities. Achievement in these areas is highly regarded by employers and Tertiary and Further Education (TAFE) institutions. Links with Universities, industry and other training organisations are in place. These provide extra learning opportunities for students, ensure teaching methods and course development are current and provides the best chance for students to reach their goals.

Established sister school relationships exist with schools in Italy, China, Japan and Cambodia. Each year the school hosts exchange students from these schools on both short and long term exchange as well as holding international cultural exchange tours to these countries for our students and teachers. International students are able to enrol at Morley Senior High School and complement the multi-cultural nature of our school. Students who require assistance with literacy skills can access our dedicated English as a Second Language Centre and special language support teachers.

Education at Morley Senior High School is seen as a partnership between staff, parents, students and the community. The school environment is designed to encourage our students to reach their potential in academic and vocational pursuits, social development and cultural understanding and empathy. Participation in sporting or extra curricula activities and community service is encouraged as an integral part of school life. The experienced and qualified staff have a repertoire of skills that enables them to personalise instruction to meet the individual learning of students through innovation, flexibility and a common commitment to each child's progress.

Our campus is built on a faculty school design around a central library. The \$3 million Trade Training

Centre, opened in 2012, provides the latest technology and equipment for students to prepare for careers in the Automotive industries and is a direct response to the 'skilling up Australia' agenda. Recent multi-million dollar upgrades to Mathematics learning areas, Science laboratories and teaching rooms provide our students with positive working environments and state of the art facilities. Modern Visual Arts, Information Technology and Aviation facilities complement the specialist programs and feature up to date technology and software where students develop their skills.

Department Endorsed Programs

- **Vocational Education and Training in Schools Program**

Implementation of VET across Australia is in accordance with the set of nationally agreed principles from Principles and Guidelines for Improving Outcomes for Vocational and Technical Education and Training (VTE) in Schools (2005 - 2008).

Vocational Education and Training (VET) in Schools programs are delivered as part of a broad, general education that combines study towards a senior secondary certificate (i.e. the Western Australian Certificate of Education - the WACE) with a nationally recognised VET qualification within the Australian Qualification Framework.



The specific areas identified as priority areas for VET in Schools for action in the Principles and Guidelines include:

- * the establishment of VET in Schools by schools not previously involved in the delivery of VET in Schools
- * expanding the range and spread of VET in Schools courses offered across industry sectors by schools already involved in the delivery of VET in Schools
- * the establishment of VET in Schools courses in new industry areas and in industry areas currently not well subscribed in VET in Schools
- * increasing participation in VET in Schools by particular student groups that are difficult to reach and/or service, for example, improving access for students in rural and remote areas and for educationally disadvantaged students including Indigenous students and students with a disability,
- * developing strategies to maintain quality standards in VET in Schools including professional development
- * increasing participation in School-Based New Apprenticeships (in WA these are called School Based Traineeships) and other trades related vocational courses which relate to skills shortages, and
- * addressing areas of skills shortage.

- **Aviation**

Morley's well established Aviation programme is diverse in content, challenging and will engage enquiring minds. Senior studies have a strong industry base and can be used, in Year 12, towards a TER score.

- **Multimedia and Broadcasting**

Multimedia and broadcasting lets children engage in drawing, digital photography, multimedia design and television production.

- **Soccer**

Providing excellence in education through sport.
